

The Levitzki Prize has been established by the Levitzki family in memory of Jacob and Charlotte Levitzki. Professor Jacob Levitzki was for many years a professor at the Hebrew University. He is considered the founder of research in Algebra in Israel. The prize is awarded every two years to a young Israeli mathematician for research in Algebra or related areas.

This is the third time this prize is being awarded. The Levitzki prize committee awarded this year's prize to Dr. Vishne for his significant contributions in an exceptionally broad spectrum of topics in algebra:  $p$ -algebras, cyclicity of division algebras, Gelfand–Kirillov dimension, algebras with polynomial identities, and Coxeter groups with applications to algebraic geometry.
